Over the past several years, significant changes have occurred to both the profession and accreditation requirements resulting in the new CAATE 2020 Professional Standards and the new edition of the BOC Practice Analysis. The CAATE Standards dictate the standards related to program design, program delivery, institutional organization and delivery, and curricular content of an accredited athletic training program. Similarly, the BOC Practice Analysis aligns with the CAATE Standards and identifies the content used in the Board of Certification examination, the examination that must be successfully challenged by all certified athletic trainers to practice clinically. Adding an accelerated program (3+2) | The Master of Athletic Training program proposes to create an accelerated Master of Athletic Training pathway (accel.M.AT.) for Exercise Science undergraduate students in the Department of Health, Human Performance and Recreation. This total five-year program will draw upon and build on the content and requirements of the existing Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science and the existing Master Athletic Training degree though the proposed program, which will offer a pathway for students to earn both the programs within five years.\\n\\nAs both programs involved in the proposed combined program currently exist at the University of Arkansas, all resources for the support of the proposed program are in place. Additionally, as the proposed program does not seek to recruit from other baccalaureate programs within the University, no other program will be impacted regarding enrollment or resources. \\n\\nBy providing a five-year, accelerated Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science and Master Athletic Training Accelerated Program, the Department of Health, Human Performance, and Recreation provides students with the opportunity to decrease the time to a postbaccalaureate degree while continuing to provide students with a high-quality experience that meets requirements for the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education (CAATE).\\n\\nThe M.AT. Program is a 59-credit degree plan, and the 24 hours of the degree plan proposed to meet the undergraduate EXSCBS requirements (40%) is below the maximum 50% allowed by the Higher Learning Commission for "4+1" (i.e., accelerated masters) programs and is on par with other accelerated Masters program's at the University of Arkansas. Peer programs in the region that have an accelerated program have anywhere from 16 to 42% of hours from the graduate program that can count towards both the graduate and undergraduate degree. Accel. M.AT. will be allowed to take three additional ATTR hours (ATTR 5161 and 5172) as an undergraduate student, but they will not count toward the undergraduate degree. The total 27 credit hours of ATTR classes are required during the undergraduate degree because the M.AT. program is cohort based. In order to have accel.MA.T students enter into the cohort model and graduate on time, they need to have completed 27 hours of ATTR classes by the time they are fully admitted into the M.AT. program. In summary, it allows the undergraduate student to matriculate into the cohort model once they become a graduate student without disrupting the timing of courses needed to graduate from the M.AT. program.

First, Department of Geosciences currently offers online geospatial courses as part of the Graduate Certificate in Geospatial Technologies. Public health applications are not the focus of current courses, and these applications are rapidly expanding in the wake of a global pandemic. In Apr 2022, in collaboration with University of Arkansas Global Campus, GEOS 5733 Geospatial Data Science in Public Health was approved as a new course intended to become an alternative to GEOS 5543 Geospatial Applications and Information Science for students with interests in public health. Second, providing a course sequence that matches what the advisor is telling students makes more sense. Effective 2020, the National Center for Education Statistics recently established a new Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) code for "Geography and Environmental Studies" which better captures the geography teaching, research and service strengths developed in recent decades at University of Arkansas. For example, the new CIP code recognizes "climate science, sustainability, environmental science and policy, research methods, geographic information systems (GIS), human geography, physical geography, remote sensing, and public policy". The online geospatial certificates were previously coded as "Geographic Information Science and Cartography" which certainly captured a large part of what the certificates focus on. However, the new geography code which encompasses technical geography makes the most sense in terms of a) providing a strong geography and environmental studies context for the certificates (which simply reflects the reality of these studies), and b) meet ADHE viability requirements by combining the certificate with the bachelor's and master's degrees in geography.

Description and 1) The Dept. of History proposes to create a justification of the request non-thesis option to complete the MA degree in History. This non-thesis option would require three additional hours of 7000-level seminar (versus the thesis option) and an oral comprehensive examination in the candidate's primary area of study, research methods, and a defense of an originally researched article length essay administered by the Masters Advisory Committee.\\n\\n2) The Dept. of History proposes to introduce a 4+1 program, where undergraduate students can take up to 12 hours of graduate courses and use them to fulfill the requirements of both the BA and the MA. These students would apply to the department and be admitted to the 4+1 program using the same metrics as the normal admission process, though they would not have to take the GRE and must produce a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 (versus 3.0 in the normal admission process). Upon completion of the BA degree and the achievement of at least a 3.0 in their graduate courses, they would be admitted to the Graduate School and complete their MA program. [1] The majority of MA students in HIST do not continue onto the PhD in HIST, therefore this alternate pathway will allow them to successfully complete the program at a faster rate as well as make the MA more relevant for their chosen career path. Other institutions the department looked at for their 4+1 programs include Maine, NYU, Cincinnati, Brown, Virginia, Yale, Tulane, Binghamton, and Arizona State. \\n\\nIn terms of minimum GPA required to be considered for admission, there is a wide range of requirements from other peer verv high research activity institutions. These range from "no requirement" (Virginia), to a 3.0 (Binghamton, for example), to a 3.25 (Florida, for example), a 3.3 (Arizona State, Tulane, and Cincinnati, for example), to a 3.5 (Georgia and Vanderbilt). The History Dept. is proposing to follow a lower minimum GPA than other UA programs (many are 3.5) and adopt the model several of these other R1 institutions have done and set our minimum at 3.25. This is also the cutoff for the top third of our undergraduate population.

Certified music education professionals receive certification in Arkansas and throughout the nation as "PreK-12 Music" indicating they are cretified to teach all levels of music education. One of the six principals of the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA) is "zero reject", indicating it is illegal to deny any students access to any program or activity in the public schools. Therefore, as a music teachers at the elementary or middle school level, general music teachers teach every child in the school population. Likewise, music teachers at the secondary level are required by law to teach every child who desires to be in a music class regardless of ability or disability.\nThe current national statistic for students identified with special needs is 12.0%. In Arkansas, that number is 12.9% with some school systems reaching as high as 22% of the total school enrollment identified under IDEA. All teachers need additional training in working with students with disabilities. This new weight is more reflective of the significance of this course within the requirements. It also helps balance the number of credits for the capstone experience among all MM concentrations.\\n\\nThe MUHS 5903 Seminar in Musicology requirement reflects changes in course offerings and course numbers that have occurred in recent years. Specifically, MUHS 5903 Seminar in Musicology and MUHS 4253/5253 Special Topics in Music History used to be cross-listed, allowing multiple levels of undergraduate and graduate students in a single class. Due to changes in the undergraduate musicology curriculum, these courses will no longer be paired. MUHS 5903 will be for graduate students only and a more rigorous seminar. MUHS 5253 will be cross-listed with undergraduate special topics courses. While the graduate version will be more demanding than the undergraduate version, it will not be a suitable replacement for the other MUTH and MUHS courses specifically listed in this degree program. \n\\nAdding the 2-credit private instruction requirement to the Music Theory allows these two credits to be listed as core MUSCMM credits, and not be concentration credits.
